Employee is diagnosed with, or is concerned about, potential communicable disease exposure.



DO NOT come to campus.


Inform Supervisor* via phone or e-mail.

Supervisor to immediately direct employee to see physician or consult their local public health unit for treatment/confirmation of diagnosis and/or further guidance.



Employee will visit or contact a physician or their local Public Health unit to:

- 1) Obtain a diagnosis.
- 2) Receive appropriate medical care/treatment.
- 3) Obtain a medical note confirming diagnosis.
- 4) If able to return to work, a written medical note MUST be obtained to confirm the employee is no longer contagious and is cleared. The medical note must be submitted to_ <u>ehs.occhealth@utoronto.ca</u>, if applicable.
- 5) UofT Occupational Health liaises with Public Health on behalf of the University where applicable and appropriate.
